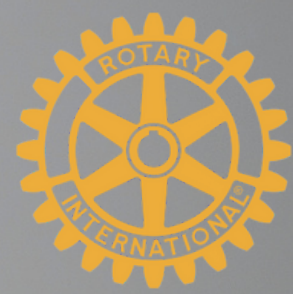

Project Pipeline Committee Objectives



Objectives:

- Offer club members a **tool** to bring their vision to life
- Improve **consistency** in planning process for new projects and appropriate **allocation** of club resources
- Drive **accountability** for resources invested and impact
- Celebrate success!



Project Pipeline Committee Operating Model

Pre-Execution

1. Project Chair fills in the project template
 - a. Project Pipeline Committee to assist
2. Board approves the project to dedicate resources
 - a. If not approved sponsor will be able to pursue the project individually

Execution & Post Execution Phase

1. During the project (targeting midway) Chair to meet with Pipeline Committee to ensure project going as planned and review to ensure resources are adequate and impact is being realized
2. After project completes Chair/Pipeline Committee to do a retrospective analysis on the template to ascertain results vs. plan in the project template
3. Project Pipeline Committee to debrief Board and Club regarding results of projects

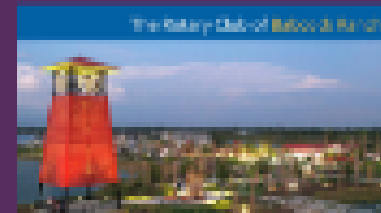

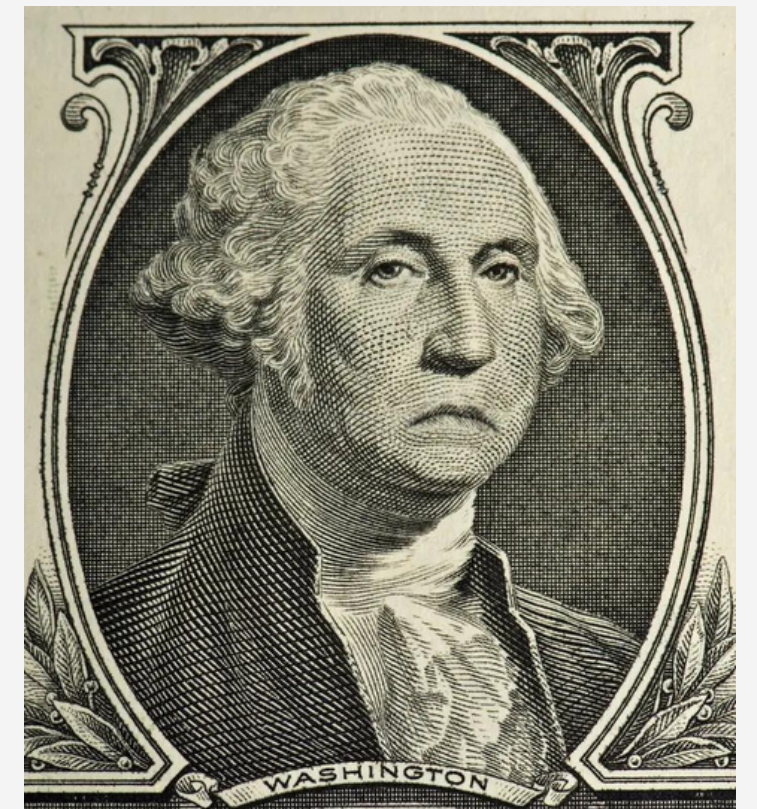
