



Key Details

- Project Description: Some of you may be already familiar with the **Open** World Program, but many are not, so we would like to introduce you to the program and the opportunities it offers. Rotary clubs are needed to host six-participant delegations for eight days and nights and prepare a professional program related to business, community, and civic life in the United States. The Open World program, operated by the Congressional Office for International Leadership (COIL), an independent U.S. federal agency, is a special program available to Rotary and Rotaract clubs in the United States through a grant secured by Rotary International. Thus, the program is available only to clubs in the United States and provides an opportunity to build fellowship and friendship to strengthen international understanding by hosting emerging leaders from Eurasia in your community. Rotary International (RI) serves as a national host organization, with Rotary and Rotaract clubs serving as local hosts for Open World delegations. Rotary clubs in 290 cities and 48 states have hosted over 4,000 of all 30,370 Open World participants throughout these years. RI can reimburse participating clubs for many of their hosting expenses through Open World grants.
- As the District International Service Chair, Priya filled out the form on July 19th, 2023, for the theme Higher Education/Impact of War.
- Desired Timeline: 26 Jan 3 Feb 2024
- Who is coming?: 6 delegates from Ukraine
- Key Milestones:
 - The delegates will meet with the club and community members in general meetings.
 - Local university and college meetings.
 - Chamber of Commerce meetings.
 - o Fort Myers Mayor's office meeting.
 - Local Environmental Committee meeting.
 - A service project in Babcock Ranch.
 - If a Washington D.C. congressional meeting is possible, that would be great.

Impact:




